- Friendly Visitor—help older adults remain independent in their own homes

- Gift Shop—Purchase and sell merchandise
- Health Services Support—Advocacy/outreach/training
- Holiday Help—Special time of year assistance at Project Linkage; special events
- Home Repair—Increase independence for seniors with minor help around their home
- Hospital Assistance—Non-medical aid around hospitals and other clinics
- Leadership roles—Advisory council; training and education; board of directors
- Mental Health—Peer counseling; education and information on mental health
- Music—Provide music at community and care facilities
- Office—Data entry; filing; answering phones; mailings; resource referral
- Shopper—Purchase groceries or personal items for older adults and people with disabilities
- Telephone Reassurance—Daily or near daily phone check-in to the home-bound
- Thrift Store—Sorting, pricing, and selling; general upkeep
- Transportation—Use your own vehicle or agency shuttle buses to drive seniors to appointments, grocery stores, and other needs
- Tutoring—With community college literacy program
- Visitor Information—Regional ambassadors dispense information; greet public
